Lesson 2:

This week's spelling rule is: Adding 'er' to words ending in 'e' with a consonant before it.

Nicer, writer, baker, safer, simpler, shaker, looser, rider, driver, dancer.

When a word that ends in 'e' has a consonant before it, you add the 'r' directly to the end of the word to make an 'er'.

Practise writing them on a piece of paper.

Remember to look at your spellings first, cover your spellings, have a go at writing each one, then check to see if you have spelled them all correct.
