New Spelling Rule!

Spelling Rules: Adding 'ing' to words ending in 'e' with a consonant before it.

Remember! A vowel is **a, e, i, o** and **u**. A consonant is all the other letters in the alphabet.

Examples

consonant → h**k**e → -e → +ing → hiking

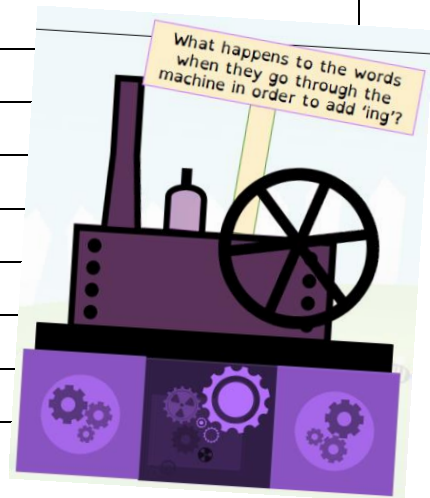
consonant → sh**n**e → -e → +ing → shining

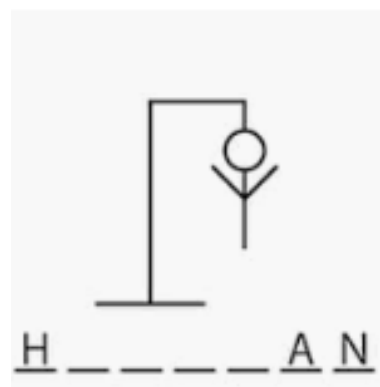
Now, let's try using some of these words by creating our own sentences. Try to include adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions into your sentences.
