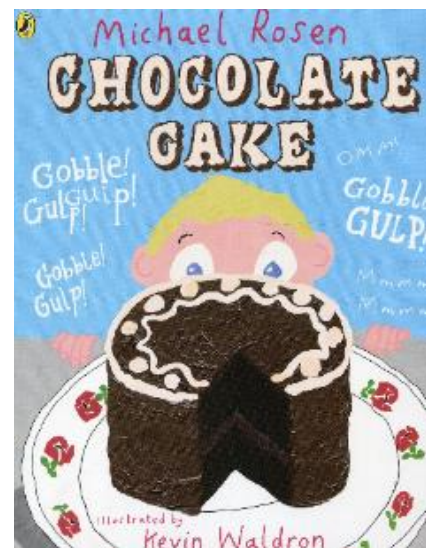
If these are too tricky, you can also go on Phonics Play to practise your phonics skills.
